- 1) Privileges – The use of the internet is a privilege, not a right, and inappropriate use will result in a cancellation of those privileges. The system administrators will deem what is inappropriate use and their decision is final. Also, the system administrators may close an account at any time as required. The administration, faculty, and staff of PAA may request the system administrator to deny, revoke, or suspend specific user accounts.
- 2) Netiquette – You are expected to abide by the generally accepted rules of network etiquette. These include (but are not limited to) the following:
 - Be polite. Do not send abusive messages to others, swear, use vulgarities, or any other inappropriate language.
 - Illegal activities are strictly forbidden
 - Do not reveal your personal address or phone numbers of students or colleagues.
 - Note that electronic mail (email) is not guaranteed to be private. Messages relating to or in support of illegal activities may be reported to the authorities.
 - Do not use the network in such a way that you would disrupt the use of the network by other users.
 - All communications and information accessible via the network should be assumed to be private property.
 - **Account holders will keep their passwords confidential and not leave open accounts unattended.**
- 3) PAA makes no warranties of any kind, whether expressed or implied, for the service it is providing. PAA will not be responsible for any damages you suffer. This includes loss of data resulting from delays, non-deliveries, mis-deliveries, or service interruptions caused by its own negligence or your errors or omissions. Use of any information obtained via PAA internet access is at your own risk. PAA specifically denies any responsibility or the accuracy or quality of information obtained through its services.
- 4) It is not acceptable to interfere with or disrupt network users, services, or equipment. Disruptions include, but are not limited to, distribution of unsolicited advertising, propagation of computer worms or viruses, and using the network to make unauthorized entry to any machine accessible via the network.
- 5) Security – Security on any computer system is a high priority, especially when the system involves many users. If you feel you can identify a security problem on the internet, you must notify a system administrator or email (chill@cauc.ca) Do not demonstrate the problem to other users. Do not use another individual's account. Attempts to login to the PAA Network as a system administrator will result in cancellation of user privileges. Any user identified as a security risk or having a history or problems with other computer systems may be denied access to the PAA computer system.
- 6) Vandalism – Vandalism will result in cancellation of privileges. Vandalism is defined as any malicious attempt to harm or destroy data of another user, internet, or any of the above listed agencies or other networks that are connected to the NSFNET Internet backbone. This includes, but not limited to, the uploading or creation of computer viruses.
- 7) It is not acceptable to transmit threatening or harassing material, or to use any profanity or sexually suggestive language in any communications. Retrieving, storing or transmitting any material (images or text) that does not uphold the objectives of this institution may lead to the withdrawal of your account privileges.
- 8) It is not acceptable to access information, such as copyright materials from vendors who clearly state that access is denied.
- 9) User understands that all sites viewed will be documented and can be reviewed without notice to the viewer/account
