Prayer, simplicity, and joy - these three words capture the essence of my recent mission trip to the Philippines. This past month, I had the incredible opportunity to serve at the Philippine Adventist Medical Aviation Services (PAMAS) base in Palawan, helping to complete an apartment building for missionaries. When this opportunity came to me in December, I prayed about it, and God opened the doors to make it happen. I am so grateful I went and was able to serve in a way that directly supports those spreading the gospel.

While there, I installed plumbing, drywall, taped, mudded, sanded, and primed the spaces for the final touches. In addition to the building project, I connected with missionaries at the main base and even climbed to one of the Indigenous schools in the mountains to witness firsthand the authentic life of the Palawano people. This was, without a doubt, the highlight of my experience. I stood in awe, deeply moved by what God has done and continues to do for the people living in these remote areas.

At PAMAS, I saw a powerful model of ministry—one that integrates faith into every aspect of life. God's blueprint for education, health, agriculture, aviation, construction, community outreach, and Bible work was not just theory, but lived out daily. As I spoke with the missionaries, it became clear that they each valued this divine plan, using it as a foundation for their work.

Through my time with them, three words resonated deeply—**prayer, simplicity, and joy**. These words encapsulate why the missionaries are there and what we, too, can embrace in our own lives.

Prayer is woven into everything they do—before, during, and after each task. Lauralea, a nurse, shared how she begins each patient interaction with prayer, asking God to lead in healing and guidance. Throughout her work, she prays for wisdom and recall, and when the visit concludes, she prays again with her patient. Prayer is not just a practice; it is a way of life.

Luis, another nurse and Bible worker, bakes 20 loaves of whole-wheat bread each week and sells them at the Brooke's Point Market. His mission is simple—build relationships through bread. After connecting with people for a few weeks, he invites them to care groups or health workshops. His market stand is nothing elaborate, yet through these simple, non-threatening interactions, he is able to share the gospel.

The missionaries at PAMAS—and the people of this island—exude a deep, authentic joy. It is not based on material wealth but on something far greater. The students in the mountains demonstrated this joy in a way that brought me to tears. When we gave them simple school supplies, their excitement was like that of children on Christmas morning. Though the items were small, their gratitude was immense, reminding me that true joy comes not from possessions but from contentment and thankfulness.

Prayer. Simplicity. Joy. These three words serve as a reminder that when we depend on God, He provides all we need. In collaboration with Him, life is richer and more meaningful.

As our PAA students prepare for their service opportunity in Jamaica, I ask that you pray for them. Pray that this experience will transform their hearts, that the Holy Spirit will move them to action, and that they will walk in step with Him in amplified ways upon their return. May this journey remind them of the Great Commission—that they are His hands, feet, and voice in this world.



Communication Week March 17-21




Communication Week is when parents/guardians and teachers meet to discuss a student's progress, strengths, and areas needing improvement.


