

EPHESIANS 2:16-22

<u>Together</u> as <u>one</u> body, Christ reconciled both groups to God by means of his <u>death on the</u> <u>cross</u>, and our hostility toward each other was put to death.

He brought this Good News of peace to you Gentiles who were far away from him, and peace to the Jews who were near. Now <u>all of us</u> can come to the Father through the same Holy Spirit because of what Christ has done for us.

So now you Gentiles are no longer strangers and foreigners. You are <u>citizens</u> along with all of God's holy people. You are <u>members of God's family</u>. Together, we are his house, built on the foundation of the apostles and the prophets. And the <u>cornerstone</u> is <u>Christ Jesus</u> himself. We are carefully joined together in him, becoming a holy temple for the Lord. Through him you Gentiles are also being made part of this dwelling where God lives by his Spirit.

PAUL DECLARES UNITY

Ephesians Chapter 2 has taught us much of the heart and practical aspects of relationship with God. There are so many benefits, access to Spiritual blessings, the things in the Heavenly realms and so much more.

Now the difficult part is what it costs. Yes, there is salvation that is free and all we have to do is believe, but that comes at a cost. I know it sounds contradictory but walk with me. To believe in Jesus and unite yourself with Him, means letting go of your own desires and clinging on to Him. Okay, sure, but what does this have to do with Chapter 2?

Chapter 2 presents another cost. When Paul wrote this letter, there was a great divide between the Jews and the Gentiles. He is now bringing this radical message, that, because of what Jesus had done on the cross, there is no longer any separation; we are all united. It costs us our own ideas and expectations. That... is a difficult concept in a time where people where forced into boxes and categories. Now this man is saying there is no more division because Jesus died on a cross and rose again?

That sounds amazing, for them... but what about now?

We see division in our world all the time. We may not be separated by Jew or Gentile, but we often have this "us vs. them" mentality that creates these walls within the faith. We are all members of God's family. When He looks at us, He doesn't see age, gender, occupation, or religion, He simply sees us as His children. One big happy-ish family, living together and trying to spread the good news together.

I challenge you to see the god in all of the people around you. Break down the walls and barriers that are creating divisions within the body of Christ. He wants us to live as one.




